

PARC FLORAL DE PARIS



A PLACE, A HISTORY

The park, which was created in 1969 to host the International Florales flower show in Paris, was designed by the landscape architect, Daniel Collin. The influence of the 1964 Olympic Games can be seen in the architecture of the roofs, pavilions and covered walkways.

THE PARK TODAY

Today, the park is designated a "Remarkable Garden" (Jardin Remarquable) by the French Ministry of Culture. Spanning almost 30 hectares, the park is committed to environmental education and plant observation, as well as leisure activities with the Delata concert area, family entertainment and play areas, in a setting where gardens and nature meet.

THE BOTANICAL GARDENS OF PARIS

The Botanical Gardens cover 70 hectares of land and curate collections on four Parisian sites, each of them with a history and a unique plant and architectural heritage.

West of Paris

- Bagatelle Park and its renowned rose garden,
- Auteuil Greenhouse Garden and its tropical landscapes.

East of Paris

- Floral Park and its local plants from Paris region,
- Arboretum of Paris and its species of trees from temperate regions of the world.

THE PARC FLORAL COLLECTIONS

More than 7,500 plant varieties, including regional flora, are displayed within landscapes that are typical or emblematic of Île-de-France ecosystems.

Some of the plants you will discover include:

- Hardy ferns and astilbes in the pine forest;
- Irises;
- Peonies and geraniums;
- Pavilions with hanging plants, Jurassic plants, and plants used in fashion and cosmetics;
- Bonsais, pelargoniums and South African flora;
- Medicinal plants and numerous themed gardens.

Special events

● THE CONSERVATORY AND THE DAHLIA COMPETITION

With a national dahlia collection certified by the CCVS (Conservatory of Specialised Plant Collections), the Parc Floral holds an annual international competition where professionals and amateurs alike present their latest creations.

● THE IRIS COMPETITION

The park plays host to the Franciris competition every two years in the spring.

● EVENTS, EXHIBITIONS AND TOURS

The Parc Floral also offers concerts, events, exhibitions and guided tours; The Maison du Jardin Botanique with its reception and exhibition areas; The Maison Paris Nature with its library, digital, event and exhibition areas, and the Butterfly garden (Open from May to October).

AUDIO-GUIDE

AUDIOSPOT, a mobile app, offers educational tours to explore the park and its botanical collections. The app is also accessible to people with visual impairments and blind people. Free download in French or English.

Do not miss!

THE UNUSUAL GARDEN

This small garden is home to plants with strange names and distinctive smells, as well as varieties of heritage vegetables from the Île-de-France region.

THE PATH OF EVOLUTION

From when they first emerged from the water, to when they started to flower, this trail recounts the long history of plants. The emergence of flowering plants is illustrated by 600 species covering half of the region's diversity.

THE NATIONAL PELARGONIUM COLLECTION

This collection showcases the diversity of botanical species, providing an introduction to the unique flora of South Africa, as well as the scents of fragrant cultivars.

THE NATIONAL IRIS COLLECTION

This collection features historical varieties from France and the Paris region, as well as modern varieties from other countries.

THE HANGING PLANT PAVILION

Orchids, bromeliads (pineapple family), araceae and ferns from overseas tropical France.

THE JURASSIC PLANT PAVILION

Ferns, cycads and conifers descended from plants from two hundred million years ago.

THE ALPINE GARDEN

High-altitude plants that thrive in the rocks and peat of France's mountain ranges.

THE EDUCATIONAL GARDEN

Inspiring budding young naturalists to take their first steps.
